The Lincoln Park Performing Arts Charter School (herein referred to as LPPACS) offers a full continuum of special education programs and services to all students eligible for such services. Special education programs and services are available for eligible children grades 7-12 and may be requested by contacting Mr. Poling, Principal and CEO, LPPACS 724-643-9004.

Special Education programs available include services for eligible students who are identified as:

LPPACS has an ongoing screening process to identify students in need of special services and specially designed instruction. The screening is conducted in August with review of all group achievement and ability test results. Individual screening as needed takes place throughout the remainder of the school year.

Parents or guardians may request their child be screened or evaluated for special education services. Requests for screening or evaluation should be made in writing and directed to Mr. P.K. Poling.
